



CME Conflict of Interest (COI) Resolution Form

The Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) requires that CME providers establish mechanisms to identify and resolve any conflicts of interest (COI). According to the ACCME, a conflict of interest exists whenever an individual in a position to control the educational content of a CME activity (e.g., planner, presenter, author) has a “financial relationship with a commercial interest and the opportunity to affect the content of CME about the products or services of the commercial interest.”

The ACCME recognizes that a variety of mechanisms and strategies may be used to resolve/manage identified conflicts. Accredited providers are expected to develop mechanisms that are appropriate for their organizations and activities. See the *Crozer-Chester Medical Center Policy for Conflict of Interest Resolution in CME Activities* for methods recommended by the CME Office to resolve various types of CME activity conflicts.
